



Woodcroft Camp: Ages 6 - 12

The Woodcroft Club's Grade School Traditional Summer Camp is specially designed for children ages 6 (completed 1st grade) - 12. Each week brings a unique theme, woven into a variety of activities, crafts, and games. Campers will also enjoy daily swim and tennis sessions, providing the perfect mix of active fun and skill-building opportunities.

Lunch and Snack:

Bagged lunches are available for \$90/week and include a main dish that you choose along with chips, a juice box, one side, one dessert, and two snacks.

Cancellations and Transfers

Cancellations processed by April 20th will result in a refund of tuition paid less a \$75 registration fee per camper. The tuition balance owed is automatically billed on April 21st. Once tuition is billed by Active on April 21st, a refund less the \$75 registration fee per child is no longer available. We encourage you to mark your calendar in anticipation of billing to ensure that you have an opportunity prior to that date, should you need to make changes to your child's registration. From April 21st until 28 days prior to the first day of the session, cancellations are eligible for a 50% refund. For a \$25 fee, transfers may be made to another session within the summer season.

***No refunds or transfers of tuition will be given when cancellation is 28 days or less from the start of the activity or session. Partial attendance will not be reimbursed or credited. Fees for lunch/snacks are fully refundable when notice is given via email to camp@woodcroftclub.org at least 7 days prior to the first day of the activity, camp or session. No credits are offered in lieu of cancellation/transfer fees at any time.

***Changes to your registration must be made by logging into your Active account. Refund balances will be processed based on the above timeline.

Curiosity Lab
June 8th - 12th

June 15th - 19th

June 22nd - 26th

A festive week celebrating summer and the Fourth of July. Campers will create bold, bright projects—some that sparkle, some that soar—and enjoy activities that capture the excitement of the season without missing the fun.

Design Like da Vinci
July 6th - 10th



Invent, imagine, and experiment. Inspired by Leonardo da Vinci's ideas and inventions, campers will design and build their own creations that twist, turn, float, and fly. This week encourages curiosity, engineering thinking, and creative problem-solving.

Discovery & Design July 13th - 17th





Plot Twist July 20th - 24th



Every camper has a story to tell. Campers will write and illustrate their own books while exploring different genres—from picture books to comics and beyond. By the end of the week, they'll have a finished creation and a stronger storytelling voice.

The Science of Art July 27th - 31st



Art and science collide in surprising ways. Campers will explore patterns, symmetry, reactions, and design principles as they create projects that blend math, science, and creativity into unexpected works of art.

Magical Mayhem
August 3rd - 7th



Science meets spectacle. With goggles on and curiosity ready, campers will explore transformations, reactions, and experiments that feel magical—while learning the real science behind the mess and mayhem.

Culinary Studio
August 10th - 14th



The kitchen becomes the classroom. Campers will practice reading recipes, measuring ingredients, and following multi-step directions as they create a variety of snacks and treats. Confidence, independence, and teamwork are on the menu. *This week will involve food items and materials that may contain allergens.*
